Reconnecting to Our Waterways (ROW) works with neighborhood, organization, and business partners across Indianapolis to help people understand the value of our waterways. No matter what neighborhood you are considering for homeownership, there is likely a waterway nearby you can enjoy through parks, greenways, trails, other destinations and activities. Every resident lives within a watershed (an area that drains to a river or stream). This means that when it rains, the actions you take in your home, yard, and community can help improve the local water quality that we, our families and the wildlife rely on. Did you know 60% of Indianapolis drinking water comes from our White River?

WATER AND SEWER UTILITIES: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW (

There are minimum monthly fees for water/ sewer service in addition to volume charges

There may be a deposit required to establish service unless creditworthiness can be established.

Homeowners are responsible for care and maintenance of water and sewer lines in their homes and in their yards, up to the main.

The meter pit and pit lid are the responsibility of the customer and should be accessible (clear of debris) at all times.

Some homes are on a septic system. Should the septic fail, a homeowner may be required to connect to a sanitary sewer by the Marion County Health Department. Costs for sewer installation is the sole responsibility of the homeowner. Certain neighborhoods are targeted for the **Septic Tank Elimination Program (STEP)** through 2025 and are eligible for Citizens Energy Groups' STEP programs and pricing. Notifications are sent to eligible residents. All others are not eligible for the program or pricing.

LEAKS: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW SO

Know where your water main shut-off is located in case of a leak. If you see water flooding an area in the yard or home, call Citizens Energy Group's (Citizens) emergency line at 317-924-3311 and know that the repair of the line is still the responsibility of the customer.

Leaks in piping in basements, burst lines. spigots, etc, are all considered visible leaks and are not eligible for an adjustment.

as running toilets, crawl space leaks, malfunctioning water softener and sump pumps are considered hidden leaks, and not visible, and may qualify for an adjustment.

TRY THIS: To test your toilets you can do a simple dye test by putting food coloring in your tank and leaving it for 15 minutes. If the colored water has leaked into your toilet bowl, you have a toilet leak and may need to replace your flapper or toilet if it cannot be repaired.

Leaks can be costly to a homeowner and should be repaired as quickly as possible. Some leaks are eligible for bill adjustments, while others are not.

Irrigation leaks can result in high water consumption and can be costly. These leaks are not eligible for adjustments and are important to repair. Leaks in the meter pit, at fittings, or couplings are the

responsibility of the homeowner to repair. If the lead is prior to the

meter, once detected by Citizens, the homeowner is notified and given 30 days to make the repair to prevent disconnection.

Underground leaks under your home slab or in your service line may be eligible for with proof of repair.

Each account may quality for a hidden leak
